

Hey! Remember Me?

Hey to everyone in TSC! First, I want to say that we have missed seeing everyone on Tuesdays and Fridays. We wish life's circumstances were like they used to be when we were able to get out more, but they aren't. We always enjoy ourselves and our TSC friends and activities. Hopefully, things will get back to normal. But it will be a while before that happens. We are blessed that none of our recent issues have been health or family related.

Shortly after a busy 4th of July plant shutdown (which lasted almost two weeks this year instead of one) I was scheduled to travel to Austria to visit the manufacturer of a new "panel saw" that my company purchased for our plant. The vendor was going to start the saw and cut panels for us to demonstrate that the saw met the specifications that my company had set. After that the saw would be crated for shipment and delivered to us. I was to fly out of Charlotte at 2:30 pm on July 23rd to meet the sales representative in Philadelphia and from there fly directly to Zurich Switzerland. The manufacturer was to meet us when we landed. From there we'd have about an hour and a half drive to get to the plant in Schwarzach Austria.

The flight over was a good one with no issues. It was dark most of the way and I was able to nap a little bit. One thing I thought was kind of neat was leaving Philadelphia with the sun setting to the west and then finding it rising from the east as we arrived in Europe only seven hours later.

We hadn't even taxied to the Zurich gate when the salesman and I started getting voicemails. There had been an emergency at our plant in Statesville and I had to return immediately. A steam drum had failed causing an explosion and a lot of physical damage at our plant. We were blessed again that no one was injured in the incident. As soon as we left the plane and made it through customs, we found the US Air desk and started looking for the next flight out. As it turned out the plane we came in on was a 'turn around'.

We would be leaving in an hour to return to Philadelphia. That was going to be cutting it close because I still had to get ticketed and back through security. Fortunately, one of the US Air customer service supervisors heard about my issue and came to help out. As soon as I got a ticket she ran me back through the airport (literally and figuratively) to catch the tram back to the gate, get through security and board the plane again. She was also able to get me through staff security instead of general security and that saved a lot of time too.

As you can imagine I didn't enjoy the return flight nearly as much. There was no napping this time and I wasn't going to risk two airline meals in a 24 hour period (although there was nothing wrong with them). By then I just didn't have any appetite. I had a pretty tight window to get through in Philadelphia which was bothersome because once you left customs you had to go back through security again before boarding. Even though the customs line moved pretty slowly, I didn't have any trouble and made it back to Charlotte around 6:00 pm and was able to get to the plant shortly after that. Everybody has noted how difficult that 24 hours must have been since I spent most of it in a plane. I have to say that I knew, and still know it was the easy part of this whole deal.

There is a great deal of damage to the line involved and the building it is in. Our insurer has led us to literally teams of recovery experts and engineers that are working to get the line going again. That is going to take some time. Our management team was able to identify a similar line in another plant about 30 miles away that was not being used. We were able to attain use of it, so last week our operators started working there producing our product at a reduced rate. We're working to increase that rate so we can bridge the gap until we get our production line back in operation. The rest of the plant resumed operations a week earlier.

Wow, I didn't think this little note would be two pages long. Anyway, we miss all of you and hope to get out again soon. We've heard about how well lessons are going and have talked about taking another Beginner II class one day, although I wouldn't argue with anyone who said we should just take Beginner I again!

Fall Cyclone Update

Ticket sales are going well, and we're moving forward with a lot of energy and excitement. Surprisingly, we always hear from a few shaggers who haven't been told about our party. We have already mailed flyer packages to all the other shag clubs. We also gave them a package at the ACSC meeting. In addition to that, we have mailed them a reminder AND sent every club an email or two about the event. Hopefully the clubs who haven't done a good job of sharing info about the Cyclone will do it before it is too late for their members to be able to attend.

Attention TSC members: When we send the email and flyer to you we need each of you to forward that email to all your shagging friends. It's also easy to post a flyer on your Facebook page or "like" posts made about the party. The effort you put forth now can make a huge difference. It will translate into less effort needed at the party and more income for your shag club.

If you need flyers, please let us know. We have plenty of them!

Pavilion schedules DJ's from 12-4, 4-7, 7-10 and 10-close. Swillies Hideaway schedules DJ's from 4-8 and 8-close.



A Slaw Recipe By Dean Melton

1/2 cup vinegar (Or use apple cider or red wine. I use half and half)

1/3 cup salad oil

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper

1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

1/2 teaspoon celery salt

1 large head of cabbage (or 2 bags shredded slaw mix)

1 medium onion, chopped

1/2 green bell pepper, chopped

Combine vinegar, oil, sugar and seasonings in a small saucepan. Heat over medium until well blended. Pour over cabbage, onion and pepper mixture. Toss to coat. Cover tightly and then refrigerate overnight.
