### **Social Dance Etiquette**

Asking for a Dance - When asking someone to dance, a person should judge first if the person they want to dance with is available or if he or she is engaged in conversation with other people. If the potential partner is in a group but likely would enjoy dancing at that moment, it's good to walk toward that person and give them solid eye contact before asking to avoid a situation where multiple people believe they have just been asked for a dance.

Partners - When engaged in a social dance environment, a person should try to dance with a wide range of partners rather than with just a select few. A dancer also should make an effort to dance with partners at all dance levels, as this improves the social dynamics of a dance. Dance etiquette actually rules against asking the same partner for more than two consecutive dances.

Declining to Dance - A person should avoid declining a dance if possible, especially to avoid hurting beginners or shy individuals. One of the biggest errors in social dancing is refusing a dance invitation because of a desire to dance with someone else. The most graceful ways to decline a dance include explaining that you don't know the dance, need to take a break or have already promised the dance to someone else. It's also proper etiquette, after declining a dance, to offer to dance with the proposer, later.

On the Floor - When heading onto the dance floor, dancers should look at the existing line of dance and be careful to stay out of the way of couples who are already dancing. In fact, if too many dancers are on the floor, it's best to leave from time to time to allow others the opportunity to dance. During a dance, a person should smile, offer eye contact and be personable with his or her partner, according to AustinSwingSyndicate.org. At the end of a dance, people should thank their partners. Their partners should respond by also saying thank you instead of "you're welcome" to avoid making the other person feel as though they danced with him or her as a favor. It's also wise to compliment a partner if he or she had any strong point.

Rotors – 2 replacement sets

Front – 6 Sets

Rear – 5 Sets

- Miscellaneous Electronics Original except for the master window control
- On-board GPS Original


This vehicle has left me "stranded" exactly one time. The problem turned out to be I'd worn out the ignition key. A replacement key from the dealer resolved the issue.
